**Qualification/Course Name:** Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation

<b>Application</b>	This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) in line with the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) Guidelines. This unit applies to all workers who may be required to provide CPR, in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.
<b>Delivery Mode</b>	This program is delivered face to face in a classroom based environment that includes simulated workplace environments.
<b>Course Duration</b>	The course will be delivered over the duration of two hours. 0915 – 1130 including short break

<b>Pre-requisites</b>	<b>Competent in written and spoken English</b> Students are required to be competent in written and spoken English to gain entry to the course. A Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Assessment is a mandatory requirement prior to enrolment. <b>Physical ability</b> It is important to note that HLTAID competency standards do require a level of physical ability to meet the evidence requirements for assessment. These standards relate to the level of performance required to provide resuscitation and respond to an emergency situation where there may be risk to life. It is a Training Package requirement of this course that you are physically capable of performing uninterrupted CPR for at least 2 minutes on a CPR manikin situated on the floor.
<b>Course Structure</b>	Training will be adapted to suit the candidate where appropriate flexibility is required.  <b>Performance Evidence:</b> The candidate must show evidence of the ability to complete tasks outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage tasks and manage contingencies in the context of the job role. There must be evidence that the candidate has completed the following tasks in line with state/territory regulations, first aid codes of practice, Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) guidelines and workplace procedures: Followed DRSABCD in line with ARC guidelines, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o performed at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) (5 cycles of both compressions and ventilations) on an adult resuscitation manikin placed on the floor</li> <li>o performed at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer CPR (5 cycles both compressions and ventilations) on an infant resuscitation manikin placed on a firm surface</li> <li>o responded appropriately in the event of regurgitation or vomiting</li> <li>o managed the unconscious breathing casualty</li> <li>o followed single rescue procedure, including the demonstration of a rotation of operators with minimal interruptions to compressions</li> <li>o followed the prompts of an automated external defibrillator (AED)</li> </ul> Responded to at least one simulated first aid scenario contextualised to the candidate’s workplace/community setting, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o demonstrated safe manual handling techniques</li> <li>o provided an accurate verbal or written report of the incident</li> </ul> <b>Knowledge Evidence</b> The candidate must be able to demonstrate essential knowledge required to effectively complete tasks outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage tasks and manage contingencies in the context of the work role. This includes knowledge of: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• State/Territory regulations, first aid codes of practice and workplace procedures including:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o ARC Guidelines relevant to the provision of CPR</li> <li>o safe work practices to minimise risks and potential hazards</li> <li>o infection control principles and procedures, including use of standard precautions</li> <li>o requirements for currency of skill and knowledge</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Legal, workplace and community considerations, including:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o awareness of potential need for stress-management techniques and available support following an emergency situation</li> <li>o duty of care requirements</li> <li>o respectful behaviour towards a casualty</li> <li>o own skills and limitations</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

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<b>Course Structure</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o consent</li> <li>o privacy and confidentiality requirements</li> <li>o importance of debriefing</li> <li>• Considerations when providing CPR, including:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o airway obstruction due to body position</li> <li>o appropriate duration and cessation of CPR</li> <li>o appropriate use of an AED</li> <li>o chain of survival</li> <li>o standard precautions</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Basic anatomy and physiology relating to:             <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o how to recognise a person is not breathing normally</li> <li>o chest</li> <li>o response/consciousness</li> <li>o upper airway and effect of positional change</li> </ul> </li> </ul>								
<b>Assessment Arrangements</b>	<p>All assessment tasks have been developed:</p> <p>(a) to meet the requirements of the relevant Training Package; and</p> <p>(b) to be conducted in accordance with the principles of assessment and the rules of evidence; and</p> <p>(c) to meet workplace and, where relevant, regulatory requirements; and</p> <p>(d) in line with systematic validation.</p> <p>Assessments have been developed to collect evidence that is in line with the principles of assessment and the rules of evidence and are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Authentic (<i>the candidate's own work</i>);</li> <li>• Valid (<i>directly related to the current version of the relevant endorsed unit of competency</i>);</li> <li>• Reliable (<i>shows that the candidate consistently meets the endorsed unit of competency</i>);</li> <li>• Current (<i>reflects the candidate's current capacity to perform the aspect of the work covered by the endorsed unit of competency</i>); and</li> <li>• Sufficient (<i>covers the full range of elements in the relevant unit of competency</i>).</li> </ul>
