Application	This unit describes the skills and knowledge required to recognise and respond to life-threatening emergencies in line with the Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) Guidelines. This unit applies to all workers who may be required to provide an emergency response in a range of situations, including community and workplace settings.
Delivery Mode	This course is a blended learning program composing of e-learning and classroom delivery. Our online program (e-learning) takes between 2-6 hours to complete with short assessments along the way, engaging the participant ensuring interaction and interest. The practical side to the unit of competency is delivered face to face in a classroom based environment that includes simulated workplace environments to gather evidence of performance and knowledge.

Pre-requisites	Competent in written and spoken English Students are required to be competent in written and spoken English to gain entry to the course. A Language, Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) Assessment is a mandatory requirement prior to enrolment. Physical ability It is important to note that HLTAID competency standards do require a level of physical ability to meet the evidence requirements for assessment. These standards relate to the level of performance required to provide resuscitation and respond to an emergency situation where there may be risk to life. It is a Training Package requirement of this course that you are physically capable of performing uninterrupted CPR for at least 2 minutes on a CPR manikin situated on the floor.
Course Structure	Training will be adapted to suit the candidate where appropriate flexibility is required. Performance Evidence: The candidate must show evidence of the ability to complete tasks outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage tasks and manage contingencies in the context of the job role. There must be evidence that the candidate has completed the following tasks in line with state/territory regulations, first aid codes of practice, Australian Resuscitation Council (ARC) guidelines and workplace procedures: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Followed DRABC in line with ARC guidelines, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> performed at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) (5 cycles of both compressions and ventilations) on an adult resuscitation manikin placed on the floor performed at least 2 minutes of uninterrupted single rescuer CPR (5 cycles both compressions and ventilations) on an infant resuscitation manikin placed on a firm surface responded appropriately in the event of regurgitation or vomiting managed the unconscious breathing casualty followed single rescue procedure, including the demonstration of a rotation of operators with minimal interruptions to compressions followed the prompts of an automated external defibrillator (AED) Responded to at least one simulated first aid scenario contextualized to the candidate’s workplace/community setting, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> demonstrated safe manual handling techniques provided an accurate verbal or written report of the incident Applied first aid procedures for the following: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> allergic reaction anaphylaxis bleeding control choking and airway obstruction respiratory distress, including asthma shock Knowledge Evidence: The candidate must be able to demonstrate essential knowledge required to effectively complete tasks outlined in elements and performance criteria of this unit, manage tasks and manage contingencies in the context of the work role.
